About EarthCare: The Leadership Challenge for the 21st Century A Georgia Power

Founded in 1989, 21st Century Leaders (21CL) is a non-profit organization that connects, transforms, and inspires high school students in Georgia to leverage diversity, explore career opportunities, and become leaders in their school, community and ultimately the workforce.

EarthCare: The Leadership Challenge for the 21st Century, supported by Georgia Power, is one of 21CL's week-long summer leadership institutes. In its 17th year, EarthCare was held from June 9-14, 2024 for 95 high school students from across the state of Georgia. Students and staff spent the week on campus at Georgia College and State University in Milledgeville, GA.

Students at EarthCare explored various energy, sustainability and STEM topics as well as leadership challenges through speakers and panels, roundtable networking, workshops on diversity and inclusion and GiANT's 5 Voices, and communication exercises with Toastmasters, all with Georgia Power professionals and community leaders. They even got to visit the nation's largest nuclear power plant! **The support of Georgia Power provided this life-changing experience at no cost to the** students.


Student Impressions & Impact

IMPACT RESULTS

99% of students reported that EarthCare met or exceeded their expectations

90% of students agree that their confidence as a leader grew this week



86% of students reported that their Networking Skills increased since attending EarthCare, **84%** of students shared that their Interpersonal Skills improved, and **79%** of students reported that their Teamwork Skills improved

32% of students reported this program was their first time visiting a college campus

19% of students reported that they were surprised at being selected to attend because they never really thought of themselves as a leader before attending

Student Impact

21st Century Leaders' programs are focused on developing skills in seven core leadership competencies. Students reported understanding the following competencies and knowing how to use them or expand them, after attending EarthCare:



EarthCare Challenge: presented by Georgia Power

In addition to workshops, networking and site visits, students worked in teams to address a "challenge" and pitched their solution to a panel of judges to close out the week. The challenge this year, presented by Georgia Power, involved developing innovative solutions to pressing issues in the energy industry, with two specific challenges to choose from: 1) Energy Conservation and Efficiency, and 2) Customer Impact.



Students who attended EarthCare received free enrollment for the 2024-25 school year to **Leadership Connect**, our online leadership development platform, where they can further develop these competencies as well as participate in activities and experiences that help them grow as leaders.

89% of students reported that after attending the institute, they are clear in knowing their career path after high school

75% of students reported that EarthCare helped improve their Critical Thinking Skills and **73%** agreed their Business Knowledge increased

60% of students reported that their career interest was reaffirmed by an experience at the institute

45% of students reported that they discovered a new career field that they are now interested in that they didn't realize prior to attending

32% of students reported that an experience at EarthCare was their first time seeing someone successful who looks like them in a career or position they are interested in


