About the Healthcare & IT Institute

Founded in 1989, 21st Century Leaders (21CL) is a non-profit organization that connects, transforms, and inspires high school students in Georgia to leverage diversity, explore career opportunities, and become leaders in their school, community and ultimately the workforce. 21CL's Healthcare & IT Institute (HII), in its fifth summer, is a week-long leadership institute focused on the career fields of healthcare and healthcare information technology (IT). This institute was held June 23-28, 2024 for 75 high school students from across the state of Georgia, and it was held at Kennesaw State University - Marietta Campus in Marietta, GA.

Students at HII explore the different aspects of the healthcare world through hands-on workshops with passionate professionals, networking opportunities and corporate insights. Business professionals from Wellstar, Piedmont Healthcare, LocumTenens.com, Mercer, and business professionals and 21CL Alumni helped the students develop personal and professional leadership skills and explore career possibilities throughout the week.

Students who attended HII received free enrollment for the 2024-25 school year to **Leadership Connect**, our online leadership development platform.

IMPACT RESULTS



95% of students now see themselves as a leader after attending HII

94% of students agree they are more likely to seek out formal leadership roles

92% of students reported that their confidence as a leader increased because of the program

86% of students reported that their Communication Skills improved, and that their Business Knowledge increased

83% of attendees shared that their Networking Skills and Interpersonal Skills improved

82% reported that their Teamwork Skills improved, and **28%** of students reported this was their first time working with a team of peers that they didn't know

71% reported that their Critical Thinking Skills improved

28% of students said their experience at HII was their first time on a college campus


The HII Challenge:
