#### **About the Film and Entertainment Institute**



Founded in 1989, 21st Century Leaders (21CL) is a non-profit organization that connects, transforms, and inspires high school students in Georgia to leverage and promote diversity and inclusion, explore career opportunities, and become leaders in their school, community and ultimately the workforce.

The Film and Entertainment Institute (FEI), presented by Warner Bros. Discovery, is a week-long, residential summer leadership institute for high school students in Georgia. In its 19th summer, this institute focuses on providing equitable access for all students to receive high level leadership training and workforce development for the film and entertainment industry.

Held at Georgia Institute of Technology on July 14-July 19, 2024 for 54 high school students from across the state, the Film and Entertainment Institute takes diverse young leaders through an exploration of media careers and leadership development through hands-on experiences with industry professionals, workshops, student-led productions, networking sessions, and behind the scenes tours. Through professional development, including dining etiquette, elevator pitches, and working in teams to present a final pitch presentation, students walk away with a life-changing experience.

98% of students reported that FEI met or exceeded their expectations

**98%** of the students reported that because of their experience they are more likely to seek out or continue seeking out leadership roles

**96%** of students reported that their Interpersonal Skills improved, while **92%** said their Critical Thinking Skills improved

**88%** of students reported that their confidence as a leader increased because of the program, while **20%** of students reported that they were surprised at being selected to attend because they never really thought of themselves as a leader before attending

**84%** of students reported that their Business Knowledge increased since attending FEI, while **80%** agreed that their Teamworking Skills improved

### **CAREER AMBITION**

**100%** of students agree that they now see themselves as a leader after attending the program

**86%** of students reported that after attending the institute, they are clear in knowing their career path after high school

**58%** of students reported that they discovered a new career field that they are now interested in that they didn't realize prior to attending FEI

**56%** of students reported that their career interest was reaffirmed by an experience at the institute
